3. Approval of the Agenda

Mr. Friedman moved to approve the agenda. Second by Ms. Halman. Carried unanimously.

4. Approval of the September 15, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Ms. Peters – correction – Deborah Chesna was present at the last meeting but is not listed.

Ms. Halman moved to approve the September 15, 2020 minutes as corrected. Second by Ms. Sonnenschein. Carried unanimously.

5. Open to the Public for Comment on Items Not on the Agenda

Ms. Greer – Blue Zones is coordinating a safety coalition involving Naples Pathways Committee, Naples Velo and others in support of unified messaging for a public education campaign on bicycle safety. Has discussed with MPO regarding same message for MPO's Traffic safety campaign resulting from Local Roads Safety Plan. Blue Zones is willing to absorb the Community Transportation Safety Team into their Build Environment Committee - the process may lead to fewer meetings but more work accomplished. Seeking comments from Committee members. Ms. Sonnenschein – great idea, in favor of it. Ms. Huff – please include Everglades City's Bike/Ped Committee. Ms. Halman – please include Immokalee as well. Ms. Lantz – suggest coordinate with CTST Chair, Kyle Kemmish. Ms. Greer – Yes, have attempted to but haven't spoken yet.

6. Agency Updates

A. FDOT

Ms. Peters – None.

Deborah Chesna – SUN-Trail Call for Projects rescinded for this year.

B. MPO Executive Director

Ms. McLaughlin – None.

7. <u>Committee Action</u>

A. Review and Comment on 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Draft Chapter 6 Cost Feasible Plan

Ms. McLaughlin presented Executive Summary contained in agenda packet. Noted that entire draft 2045 LRTP has just been loaded on MPO's website. Committee members encouraged to review and comment on any portion of the Plan. Described Needs Plan (Ch4) and Cost Feasible Plan (Ch 6), key information contained in charts showing project name, to/from, time period, funding. Ms. Halman – Immokalee Rd carries traffic to/from Casino. That segment should be done first. Ms. Scott – explained relationship between County's Annual Update and Inventory Report (AUIR), Capital Improvements Program, developer agreements and phasing projects in the LRTP. Ms. Sonnenschein – referring to Paradise Coast Trail Vision as example, when is it possible to request modifications to roadway designs to accommodate bike/ped facilities? **Ms. Scott** – most are County roads, go through various steps such as 30%, 60% design, PD&E locks in cross section. County is aware of Paradise Coast Trail and proposed FPL greenway and considers that as well as Bike/Ped Master Plan when designing roads. Mr. Bonness – example is 6-lane section of Oil Well Rd has greenway on north side. Ms. Fendrick – segment with pathway gap on US41 East falls within project #58 [Map ID Number]. Ms. Scott – could be done sooner if additional ROW not needed. Ms Fendrick – aren't local developers required to provide bike/ped facilities? Ms. Scott – not when a capital project is planned that would necessitate tearing improvements out within 5-10 years. Ms. Huff - can trail be placed behind bushes? Ms. **Scott** – probably build to align with previous section.

Ms. Peters [interjected later in meeting] – FDOT's Project Manager reports that 60% plans completed in 2012, will revisit, project is a candidate for design/build; is 90% confident additional ROW will not be needed unless design standards change, affect should be minor.]

Ms. McLaughlin – continued overview - where to find SU Box fund discussion. Proposal to add Safety Projects, which in addition to Planning projects (such as the LRTP) would modify current 40:40:20 split divided among Bike/Ped, Congestion Management and Bridges. Revised Budget would be Planning 3%, Bike/Ped 38%, Congestion Management 38%, Bridge 19%, Safety 2-3%. Transportation Alternative – Urban (TALU) funds may be able to make up difference in SU for bike/ped. Preliminary proposal. Interested in Committee's comments. Safety projects important to include now that Board has adopted FDOT's Vision Zero Safety Targets. Note widespread interest in Traffic Safety Education campaign.

Mr. Bonness – could be a good trade off. **Mr. Musico** – net comes out about the same, may as well codify. **Ms. Halman** – funding for safety should be ongoing. **Ms. Jacob** – agree with concepts, concerned with duplication of effort among entities developing safety campaigns. Will education be a focus? **Ms. McLaughlin** – Yes. Local Roads Safety Plan recommends multifaceted approach including Engineering (design), Education, and Enforcement. Education is key. **Dr. Friedman** – proposed toll roads, will they consider bike/ped safety? **Mr. Bonness** – FDOT is looking at multimodal [for MCORES]but bike/ped won't be included on I-75 [managed lanes study].

Ms. Halman moved to approve for moving forward, Chapter 6 Cost Feasible Plan of the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP. Ms. Jacob seconded. Passed unanimously.

8. Reports & Presentations (May Require Committee Action)

A. FDOT D1 Districtwide Pedestrian-Bicycle Active Transportation Plan

Ms. Chesna – gave PPT presentation [MPO will provide electronic copy on request]. The Active Transportation Plan will build on existing local partner agencies plans, highlight gaps and needs for bike and ped infrastructure, prioritize improvement sand outline types of infrastructure intended along FDOT roadways by facility type. Prioritization metrics include safety, connectivity, equity, economic vitality, comfort – based on Level of Traffic Stress / Bicyclist Design user profiles analysis. Streetlight data used. FDOT's interactive mapping / analysis tool will be made available for public use.

B. Everglades City Bicycle & Pedestrian Master Plan

Ms. Huff and Ms. Fendrick gave update highlighting the planning process and the details contained in the exhibits in agenda packet. The Everglades City Council adopted the Bike/Ped Master Plan on October 6, 2020. Described Phase 3 road diet on Copeland Ave South to City limits and Broadway sidewalks. County has maintenance responsibility. Decided to expand road diet concept on Copeland Ave south to north segment. Concept approved by Everglades City Council in September. Will be first road diet approved in Collier County, good location due to low traffic demand. Phase 4 in a commercial area, no sidewalks, informal, overflow parking off edges of road. Roads tend to flood during heavy rains, king high tides, any improvements for sidewalks/bike lanes will require road reconstruction. Chokoloskee Causeway has 5' wide pathway, heavily used, 2-way traffic, not easy to pass, would like to expand multiuse path to make wider, add benches, tables, shade trees, shade structures, as a linear park. Fishing off bridge. Family friendly location, distance between Chokoloskee and Everglades City. Old Railroad ROW privately owned by local businessman, somewhat open, if can make a profit, to Rails-to-Trails proposal to connect Everglades City to Fakahatchee off-road. Phase 4 includes Everglades School, only 10% walk, ride or use golf cart to go to school. Most get picked up by bus. Want to encourage Safe Routes to Schools. Would like to develop more sidewalks and bike lanes in that area. [Everglades City is a designated Golf Cart Community, too.]

Ms. Huff asked whether Committee needs to take action to endorse the Plan. **Ms. McLaughlin** – the MPO's 2019 bicycle/Pedestrian Master Plan states that the Everglades City plan, when adopted, will be included in the MPO's BPMP by reference. [see p5], but it is always helpful to formally acknowledge the Committee's support.

Mr. Musico – move to include the Everglades City Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan in the MPO's Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan by reference. **Dr. Friedman** – seconded motion. Passed unanimously.

C. Public Meetings – Quorum Requirement

Ms. McLaughlin – unless Governor extends Executive Order, will have to establish physical quorum in meeting room, then committee can vote to allow other members to participate remotely. Public and consultants can participate remotely. CR 609/610 has technology installed to host hybrid virtual/in-person meetings.

9. Members Comments

Ms. Halman – unable to watch 2045 CFP video on home computer. **Ms. McLaughlin** – may be a bandwidth problem.

Ms. Peters just received notice via an email that [virtual] CTST meeting has just been scheduled for this Thursday at 10 am [10/22/20].

OBJECTIVE: For the Committee to elect a Chair and Vice-Chair for calendar year 2021.

CONSIDERATIONS: The BPAC by-laws require that the Committee elect a Chair and Vice-Chair at the first regularly scheduled meeting of each year when a quorum is attained.

Any committee member may nominate or be nominated as Chair/Vice-Chair. Elections shall be decided by the majority vote of committee members present. The Chair and Vice-Chair shall serve a one-year term or until a successor is elected. Joe Bonness is the current Chair; Anthony Matonti is the current Vice-Chair.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY COMMITTEE ACTION ITEM 7B

Endorse Amendment to Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) Bylaws

OBJECTIVE: For the committee to endorse an amendment to the BPAC bylaws.

CONSIDERATIONS: The BPAC has been unable to meet the in-person quorum requirement since the expiration of the Governor's Executive Order (EO) 20-69 on November 1, 2020. EO 20-69 had temporarily suspended requirements for local government bodies to hold a quorum in-person or meet in a specific public place in response to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

MPO staff contacted BPAC members regarding their willingness to attend in-person meetings. A majority expressed concern with attending meetings in-person due to the COVID-19 pandemic. One member resigned, expressing an unwillingness to attend in-person meetings during the pandemic coupled with a dislike of virtual meetings.

MPO staff proposed a revision to Section V.E. of the BPAC bylaws reducing the number of committee members needed in attendance to create an in-person quorum from a majority of voting members to a total of four (4). The proposed change is shown in **Attachment 1** in <u>strikethrough/underline</u> format followed by the clean version.

The BPAC was unable to meet the in-person quorum requirement in November 2020 and January 2021. If the MPO Board votes to approve the amendment, MPO staff anticipate being able to convene the committee in February so members can vote to endorse the action the Board has taken. Staff will communicate the committee's action to the Board at the March 12, 2021 meeting.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: For the committee to endorse the amended BPAC bylaws.

COLLIER COUNTY BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE BYLAWS

The following Bylaws guide the proper functioning of the Collier Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee. The intent is to provide procedures and policies to assist the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory committee to accomplish its purpose.

SECTION I: NAME

The name of this Committee shall be the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (hereinafter the "BPAC") of the Collier Metropolitan Planning Organization (hereinafter, the "MPO").

SECTION II: PURPOSE

- A. The purpose of the BPAC is to provide citizen input into the deliberation of bicycle- and pedestrian-related issues within the community, to advise the MPO on developing a Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan (BPMP) that is responsive to the needs of the community, to recommend policies and advise the MPO Board of opportunities that will improve the walking and bicycling environment, recommend priorities for bicycle and pedestrian projects and program implementation, and contribute to the BPMP's vision and recommendations regarding the development of the bicycle and pedestrian network.
- B. The mission of the BPAC is to promote walking and bicycling as integral components of local, regional and state recreational and transportation networks.

SECTION III: MEMBERSHIP, APPOINTMENT AND TERM OF APPOINTMENT, AND TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP

A. Voting Members:

The BPAC shall be composed of twelve (12) at-large voting members representing a wide cross-section of Collier County residents and neighborhoods, bicycle and pedestrian safety professionals, Safe Routes to Schools organizations, transit riders, local bicycle and pedestrian advocacy groups, organizations that encourage active transportation from a community health perspective, and advocates for persons with disabilities, and other transportation disadvantaged populations.

B. Appointment and Term of Appointment:

1. All BPAC members are appointed by the MPO for a fixed term of two (2) years.



2. Reappointment to additional term(s) may be approved by the MPO at the written request of the BPAC member.

C. Termination of Membership:

If at any time, the MPO believes that any BPAC member is not performing his or her duties in accordance with these bylaws, the MPO may remove that member from the BPAC.

SECTION IV: OFFICERS, TERMS OF OFFICE, AND DUTIES

A. Officers and Terms of Office:

- 1. A Chair and a Vice-Chair of the BPAC shall be elected at the first regularly scheduled meeting of each calendar year when a quorum is attained and shall hold the offices until their successors are elected.
- 2. Any voting member may nominate or be nominated as an officer. All elections shall be held by the majority vote of voting members present.
- 3. The Chair and Vice-Chair shall serve for a period of one (1) year or until a successor is elected.
- 4. The Chair and Vice-Chair shall be voting members of the BPAC.

B. Chair Duties:

- 1. The Chair shall preside at all meetings and shall be responsible for the conduct of such meetings.
- 2. The Chair and the MPO Director shall collaborate to establish the agenda for meetings. The Chair acts as a liaison with governmental bodies and other related committees.

C. Vice-Chair Duties

- 1. The Vice-Chair shall, during the absence of the Chair, have and exercise all of the duties and powers of the Chair.
- 2. The Vice-Chair shall also perform such duties as may be assigned by the Chair.

D. Absenteeism of an Officer:

If both the Chair and Vice-Chair are absent from a meeting, the Committee shall elect a voting member present to be the Chair for that meeting.



- 1. Any vacancy in an office created by a resignation or replacement of an Officer shall be filled by a majority vote of voting members.
- 2. The Officer so elected shall fill the remainder of the unexpired term of the vacant office.
- 3. If, at any time, the Committee believes that an Officer is not performing his/her duties in accordance with Section IV, Subsection B and C, it may recommend the removal of the Officer to the MPO.

SECTION V: MEETINGS

A. Regular Meetings:

The BPAC shall meet as often as necessary in order to meet its responsibilities. A meeting schedule shall be developed annually, endorsed by the BPAC and approved by the MPO.

B. Special Meetings:

Special meetings may be called by the Chair in coordination with the MPO Director with a minimum of three (3) calendar days' notice, indicating the reason for the meeting and notifying all member agencies.

C. Notice of Meetings:

A minimum of seven (7) calendar days notice shall be given for regular meetings. Agendas should be sent with meeting notices and, wherever possible, minutes of the previous meeting, at least seven (7) calendar days prior to any regular meeting and at least three (3) calendar days prior to any special meeting.

D. Agendas:

MPO staff is responsible for preparing agendas for each BPAC meeting. Members may request to place items on the tentative agenda by notification to the MPO staff.

E. Quorum:

1. A quorum shall consist of a majority four of the voting members being physically present at each meeting.

F. Voting:

An affirmative vote of a majority of the BPAC members present shall be necessary in order to take any action.



G. Public Meetings:

All meetings of the BPAC are open to the public and all activities of the BPAC are subject to the Florida Government in the Sunshine Law, Chapter 286, *Florida Statutes*, commonly known as the Sunshine Law.

H. Parliamentary Procedures:

Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, Roberts Rules of Order shall be followed at all meetings.

I. Staff

- 1. The MPO shall provide the BPAC with sufficient staff support and resources to enable it to fulfill its responsibilities.
- 2. MPO staff shall manage and oversee the operations of the BPAC and assist in scheduling meetings, preparing agenda packets, and other necessary administrative duties as required by the BPAC within the limits of the resources available.
- 3. Staff shall maintain the minutes and other records of the BPAC.

J. Attendance:

- 1. It is the intent and strong desire of the MPO that there be full attendance of the BPAC members at all BPAC meetings; recognizing, however, that it may be necessary for BPAC members to be absent from a meeting due to unusual or emergency circumstances. Nevertheless, full attendance at BPAC meetings is encouraged and necessary for the proper operation of the BPAC, and in furtherance thereof, the following requirements are established.
- 2. Any BPAC member who is absent from three consecutive OR four (4) out of six (6) regularly scheduled BPAC meetings shall be deemed to have tendered his or her resignation from the BPAC.
- 3. The MPO shall, as soon as practical after such resignation, declare the position to be vacant and shall promptly fill same.
- 4. No BPAC member shall serve at any meetings after he/she is deemed to have tendered his/her resignation.

SECTION VI: AMENDMENTS

A. Amendments:

Amendments to these Bylaws may be endorsed by an affirmative vote of the BPAC, provided a copy of the proposed amendment shall have been sent to every member at least seven (7) calendar days prior to a vote for endorsement by the BPAC. All proposed



amendments shall be voted on at regular meetings. Any and all amendments to the Bylaws are subject to approval by the Collier MPO.

B. Prior Agreement:

These Bylaws supersede and replace any and all Bylaws previously adopted by the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee.

C. Effective Date:

These Bylaws for the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee of the Collier County Metropolitan Planning Organization are hereby endorsed in an open session with a quorum present and voting on ________, 2021 by the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee and subsequently approved and adopted by the Collier Metropolitan Planning Organization on February 12, 2021.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY REPORTS & PRESENTATIONS ITEM 8A

FDOT's Draft Tentative Work Program FY 2022-2026

OBJECTIVE: For the Committee to receive a briefing on FDOT's Draft Tentative Work Program FY 2022-2026.

CONSIDERATIONS: FDOT has released the Draft Tentative Work Program FYs 2022-2026 on January 8, 2021 (**Attachment 1**). FDOT focused on programming bike/ped projects as per the Board's SU allocation policy, as evident from reviewing the. Summary of Additions and Reschedulings (**Attachment 2**).

The MPO's SUNTrail network received a boost with the news that the Livingston FPL Trail Extension received \$1.1 million in SUNTrail funding for a PD&E study in FY26 and that FDOT has programmed \$300,000 and will act as lead agency for the Marco Loop Trail Feasibility Study which also received funding in FY22.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION: That the Committee receive a briefing on FDOT's Draft Tentative Work Program FY 2022-2026.

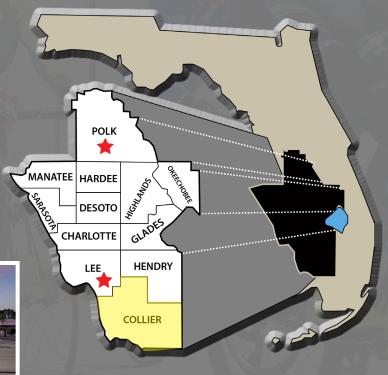
TENTATIVE FIVE YEAR WORK PROGRAM FISCAL YEARS 2022-2026

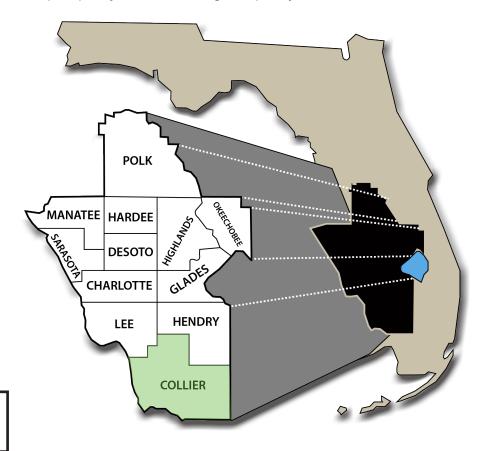

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY COMMITTEE PRESENTATION ITEM 8A

2021 Call for Projects

OBJECTIVE: For the Committee to receive a briefing on the 2021 Call for Projects application process, schedule and forms.

<u>CONSIDERATIONS</u>: Chapter 7 – Policies and Implementation, of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan (BPMP) establishes the process staff follows when issuing a Call for Projects. The relevant sections are Funding Priorities and Evaluation Criteria, on pages 67-69 (**Attachment 1**). According to the MPO's SU allocation and projected revenues established in the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan – Cost Feasible Plan, approximately \$5 million will be available for programming bike/ped priority projects in FY 2028. See Bicycle Pedestrian Box Funds on Table 6-7 p 6-15 (**Attachment 2**).

COLLIER MPO 2021 CALL FOR BIKE-PED PROJECTS

Collier MPO follows the process outlined in the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan (BPMP) Chapter 7 – Policies and Implementation when issuing a Call for Project. The BPMP identifies Funding Priorities and Evaluation Criteria (**Exhibit A, Attachment 1**). The 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan – Cost Feasible Plan establishes a programming budget of approximately \$5 million for bike/ped projects in Fiscal Year 2028. See Bicycle Pedestrian Box Funds on Table 6-7 p 6-15 in the 2045 LRTP, **Exhibit A, Attachment 2**.

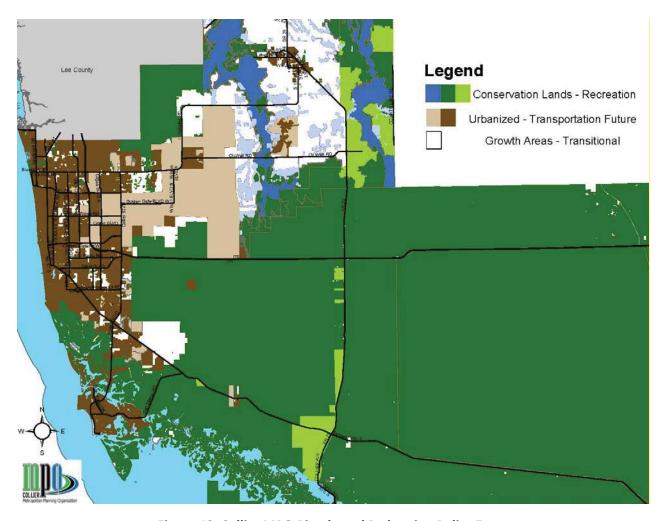


Figure 48. Collier MPO Bicycle and Pedestrian Policy Zones

Funding Priorities

The MPO Board establishes policy by which it allocates Surface Transportation-Urban (SU) funds for 1) congestion management, 2) new bridge construction, and 3) bicycle and pedestrian projects. MPO staff issues a Call for Projects based on the Board's established allocation policy and schedule, which is currently on a five-year rotation among the three categories. MPO member entities submit bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure projects that implement the current, adopted Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan, which is, or will be, incorporated by reference into the current, adopted LRTP. Bicycle and pedestrian projects range from locations on local, collector, and arterial roads to greenway connections, RSAs, and special studies.

1) The Network Needs analysis (Chapter 5) identifies the MPO's priorities for funding projects based on safety, equity, and connectivity. In addition, the MPO's priorities include the projects recommended in adopted Community Walkability studies and the current adopted bicycle and/or pedestrian master plans of the cities of Marco Island, Naples, and Everglades City and CRAs in Collier County, all of which are incorporated by reference.



- 2) MPO staff will coordinate with FDOT and local entities to implementing RSA recommendations that the MPO Board has specifically endorsed.
- 3) The MPO's priority projects include planning, designing, and constructing Complete Streets retrofits to coincide with a) the FDOT top five high-crash corridors, b) high-use CAT routes, and c) equity. The two highest priority Complete Streets retrofit projects are:
 - a) US-41 between 5th Avenue/9th Street intersection and Airport Road
 - b) Airport Road from US-41 north to Radio Road

Evaluation Criteria

- 1) MPO staff will issue a Call for Projects on an as-needed basis, based on the MPO's current adopted TMA SU "Box" allocation/programming policy. The Board has sole discretion to set this policy and may change it at any time pursuant to the MPO Bylaws and Public Participation Plan.
- 2) Member entities are free to choose which projects to submit as long as they are identified in the Network Needs analysis (Chapter 5) and/or other local plans incorporated by reference in this Plan. Member entities may submit up to one project for each jurisdictional area represented by voting membership on the Board, and MPO staff may submit one project of regional significance, for a total of 10 projects in response to any Call for Projects:
 - 1 project located in each County Commissioner District (total 5)
 - 2 projects located within the City of Naples
 - 1 project located within City of Marco Island
 - 1 project located within City of Everglades City (inclusive of Chokoloskee and Plantation Island)
 - 1 project submitted by MPO staff
- 3) MPO staff will conduct a preliminary assessment of submitted projects for eligibility according to the following criteria; incomplete project submittals will not be considered for funding:
 - Timeliness the submitting agency verifies that the project can and should be designed and constructed within the time-period selected for funding.
 - Constructability the submitting agency verifies that the project is fully scoped, the right-of-way is available, and cost estimates are complete and accurate.
 - Funding Availability the submitting agency has identified funding that is currently available for programming by the MPO and funding available for programming by the local entity. Funding availability must be sufficient to meet project costs.
- 4) MPO staff will conduct a preliminary prioritized ranking of eligible projects based on the following scoring criteria. The BPAC, CAC, and TAC will review and comment on the ranking and endorse with adjustments as deemed warranted. Projects will be scored and ranked according to the method listed below. The score is cumulative depending on the number of factors addressed:
 - Safety
 - o Implements a recommended action in a Bicycle/Pedestrian Road Safety Audit 5 points



- Addresses a safety concern involving serious injuries and fatalities as identified in this Plan,
 absent a Safety Audit to verify the proposed mitigation measure 3 points
- Addresses a safety concern involving crashes of less severity, absent a Safety Audit to verify the proposed mitigation measure – 2 points
- Addresses a safety concern expressed by members of the public in the absence of crash records – 1 point

Equity

- Fills a need associated with an Environmental Justice community or use identified in this Plan –
 5 points
- Fills a need associated with an area that meets some, but not all EJ criteria used in identifying EJ communities for this Plan 3 points
- Fills a need associated with an area that does not have adequate access to nonmotorized transportation facilities based upon public input received in the development of this Plan – 1 point

Connectivity

- o Fills a prioritized infrastructure gap identified in this Plan 5 points
- Fills a need for improved connectivity based upon public input received in the development of this Plan – 2 points
- 5) MPO staff will present the complete record of staff and advisory committee rankings to the MPO Board. The Board has sole and final decision-making authority in determining the final list of priorities in ranked order. MPO staff will submit the Board's adopted project priorities to FDOT on or before June 30th.

MPO Programs and Special Events

MPO staff will incorporate bi-lingual educational material from NHTSA, such as flyers, brochures, posters, and Public Service Announcements (PSAs), and will work with the Community Traffic Safety Team to augment distribution of the materials.

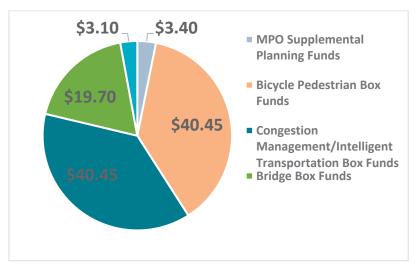
Staff will work with the CTST and FDOT to use changeable message signs on both Airport Road and US-41 to display to motorists the need to follow the three-foot rule and to watch for cyclists at driveway crossings.

MPO staff will help promote outreach and education opportunities offered throughout Collier County on the MPO website and through social media. Example programs include Walk/Bike to School Day, Bike to Work Day/Week, Safe Kids SWFL, bike helmet fittings and giveaways, carseat fittings and giveaways, bike rodeos, programs such as Summer Nights, Winter Nights, and Fridays Nights (safety programs targeting school-age kids and their parents), and Ciclovía (Spanish term that means "cycleway)," an event in which a permanent bike path or certain streets are closed to automobiles for cyclists and pedestrians. Ciclovia Immokalee! has hosted events in May and August 2017 and 2018 in a parking lot (see http://www.cicloviaimmokalee.org/august-4-2018-ciclovia-immokalee-joins-lipman-family-farms-at-their-backpack-giveaway/).
