Collier MPO Board Action Recap

The Collier MPO Board welcomed two new Board members—County Commissioners Dan Kowal (District 4) and Chris Hall (District 2). The Board took action on the following items at the December 9, 2022 meeting:

- Approved the Congestion Management Process Origin & Destination Report and Congested Corridor Fact Sheets (unanimous vote)
- Approved the transfer of up to \$2.5 million in FY23 SU Funds to the CAT Maintenance & Operations Facility Replacement Project (vote 7 for/ 2 against)
- Adopted County's Updated Transit Asset Management Plan Performance Targets (unanimous)
- Nominated Collier County BCC to Remain as Community Transportation Coordinator for the Transportation Disadvantaged (unanimous)
- Adopted FDOT's Vision Zero Safety Performance Targets for Calendar Year 2023 (unanimous)



December Safety Message

As was discussed during the Board meeting, one of the most common vehicular/cyclist crashes occurs when cyclists ride on a sidewalk on the wrong side of the road (against traffic). Drivers, accustomed to the slower walking pace of pedestrians, aren't likely to be aware of a cyclist approaching rapidly from the right when their attention is focused on vehicular traffic approaching from the left.
