WHAT'S HAPPENING AT COLLIER MPO?

Collier MPO is preparing to kick-off their 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP), Safe Streets For All (SS4A) Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, Transit Development Plan (TDP) Major Update, as well as preparing for a federal review occurring in July 2024.

Executive Director, Anne McLaughlin, has signed on with Collier MPO for up to another year. Although announcements were made regarding her retirement in March 2024, she has extended her contract until March 2025. The MPO Board approved her contract extension at their February 9, 2024 meeting.

CAT'S "BEACH BUS" IS BACK FOR THE SEASON!

Collier Area Transit's Paradise Beach Trolley shuttles passengers from the Conner Park parking lot on Bluebill

Avenue to Delnor-Wiggins Pass State Park, and Vanderbilt Beach, from February 16, 2024, through April 28, 2024, every Friday, Saturday, Sunday.

BRIGHTLINE: NEXT STOP, SWFL?

A smooth 3 hour and 30-minute ride from Miami to Orlando on Brightline made previously doubtful State Representative Karen Gonzalez Pittman a believer in the benefits of high-speed rail. "You could feel what this was going to do to our state, how this was going to bring people closer."

The first-term lawmaker is now working to bring high-speed rail to Tampa. She's submitted a request for \$50 million in state funding for an extension along the Interstate 4 corridor, where Brightline aims to use the median at speeds of up to 150 mph.

In January, Senator Nick DiCeglie of Pinellas County, filed a bill that would require FDOT to preserve the rail corridor during the \$2 billion I-4 expansion that begins later this year. Read more at <u>Mass Transit</u>.
